#### Pastor's Epistle

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

I could talk about the dreadful situation of these unattended minors crossing the borders – refugees running from very life-threatening situations. Or I could talk about the ferocious and horrible violence of the Middle East . . . all of which are real, frightening, and over which we have little, if any control. These events shape our world, raise up within us Christian compassion, and define for us a state of helplessness and powerlessness. What does scripture say about this?

In Mark 9. 33-37, we read: "Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it into his arms, he said to them, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."

And again in 10. 13-16: "People were bringing little children to him (Jesus) in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them."

We can remind our leaders who confess devotion to Christ, that, as Christians our first and primary call is to serve Christ by serving others. Right now, these children are the face of Christ for us. What are they going to do for these children as they await processing according to the George W. Bush 2008 Law passed by Congress? Leave them in unsanitary conditions like cattle or pigs to slaughter? In the scriptures above, Jesus embraces the children, and says that however we extend or withhold assistance to these children, we are extending or withholding assistance to Jesus Christ himself.

We are not called to judge these children, their parents, or their countries. We are called to love others as Christ loves us and gave himself for us on the cross. What does that look like for us here at St. Paul's? I hope, as a congregation, we lift up our voices to our national, state, and local leaders and ask them to provide ways to help these children as they wait in limbo for their case to be processed. We can call into question our own national decisions which might have caused, encouraged, or resulted in the patterns of destruction now occurring in these countries.

Maybe God is calling us to do something; if so, what might that look like? Below is an article from the ELCA website:

#### **Migrant Children**

#### The Situation:

The recent influx in unaccompanied and migrant children arriving in the United States is a result of risk factors causing them to leave their home countries. The children's countries of origin are aggravated by lack of protection from drug trafficking, violence, sex trafficking, poverty and unemployment, among other factors. As a result, these children are vulnerable to harmful acts, such as gender-based violence, harassment, persecution and extortion. Some children are hoping to reconnect with family members who have migrated to the U.S.

#### Our Response:

As members of the ELCA, we are called to love and welcome all. We answer the call when children who are running from hunger, poverty and harm arrive on our doorstep. We believe it is our responsibility to protect and care for those who are most vulnerable by providing services to ensure their safety, upholding their human rights and recognizing and preventing risks of exploitation. In a living example of caring for our neighbor, the ELCA – through Lutheran Disaster Response – is responding to the arrival of these children with grace and compassion.

Lutheran Disaster Response, working with companions and strategic allies such as Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services, is committed to walking with unaccompanied and migrant children within this country and across borders.

#### What Can You Do?

**Pray:** Pray for those affected by violence, that they may be granted peace and healing.

#### Give

Your gifts designated for Unaccompanied and Migrant Children will be used in full (100 percent) to assist those directly impacted by this crisis. Gifts from people like you allow us to respond to those who are most vulnerable.

#### Format Change for Children's Church/Sunday School for 2014-2015

Children's Church will begin this fall on Sunday, September 14.

After reviewing the results of a phone survey, from the children's parents, for the best time for the children to attend Children's Church; it was decided to hold it after worship on Sundays from 10:15 am to 10:45 am.

We are excited as we will be able to have 2 separate classes this year:

GROUP A—Pre-school (3 yr old) to Kindergarten (7 students will be in this group)

GROUP B—1st grade to 3rd grade (5 students will be in this group)

During the worship service there will be a Children's sermon time; where the children are invited to come forward for a message from Pastor Reed. We will have Activity Packets for the younger Group A children to use during worship. We will also have available Children's Bulletins for the older Group B children to use during the worship service. These will be found in the fellowship hall.

#### **TEACHERS NEEDED**

Because we will be doing 2 classes this year, we will need everyone's help. We, as a congregation, made a promise to support all of these children when they were baptized. Part of that support is to help their parents by teaching the scriptures and providing access to worship where they will hear the word of God, the Lord's Prayer, the Creed and the Ten Commandments. They also receive instruction for receiving Holy Communion and participating in the sacraments. Children's Church is one of the best ways for all of us to make good on this promise.

We need 2 teachers each Sunday; we hope to have 12 people to sign-up as teachers. This would allow us to have a teacher rotation where you only <u>teach once every 6 weeks</u>. No teaching expertise required; what's needed is a faith-filled heart and a desire to pass on the faith. Lessons will be prepped for the teachers ahead of time. We welcome the confirmed youth of St. Paul's to volunteer to teach a class. *This is a good way for confirmed high school members to earn silver service hours for graduation.*Sign-up sheet is in the fellowship hall.


