People, did you know? The Lord is coming! Prepare the way of the Lord! November 27th begins our watch for the Advent of our God, leading up to Christmas celebration. The following gives a brief explanation of Advent:

Advent, anglicized from the Latin word adventus meaning "coming", is a season observed in many Western Christian churches, a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. It is the beginning of the Western liturgical year and commences on Advent Sunday, called Levavi.

Latin adventus is the translation of the Greek word parousia, commonly used in reference to the Second Coming of Christ. For Christians, the season of Advent serves as a reminder both of the original waiting that was done by the Hebrews for the birth of their Messiah as well as the waiting of Christians for Christ's return from Heaven where he now sits at the Right Hand of God. I have a few ways you can prepare the way of the Lord:

<u>Fun</u>: Using the tune of the Cubs Fight Song, "Go Cubs Go!", use the following words: Come Lord Come! Come Lord Come!

Hey Christians, whaddaya say? Jesus Christ is coming our way! (repeat) (Originally written by Steve Goodman, 1984)

Experiential: In her book *Accidental Saints*, Nadia Bolz-Weber offers a chapter called "A Thief in the Night," based on Matthew 24 (New York: Convergent Books, 2015, pp. 53–62). She shares her suggestion that her congregation, instead of making Christmas lists of gifts they'd like to receive, make Advent lists of things they'd like Jesus to break in and take away. Invite your people to do the same, "in the hopes he could pickpocket the stupid junk in our houses, or abscond with our self-loathing or resentment . . . maybe break in in the middle of the night and take off with our compulsive eating or our love of money" (p. 59). <u>Use sounds</u>: What wakes you up? Do you only need something to get you up in the morning? Or does something or someone else remind you to be mindful, watchful for Jesus? Set your TV, your tablet, cell phone, stove or microwave to go off at different times to remind you that Jesus is coming and we need to be attentive and prepared for his presence day or night. <u>Use visuals</u>: Jesus is the light of the world. Light a candle for each Sunday in Advent. "The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it". John 1.5. There are 4 Sundays in Advent. Maybe make a wreath with 4 candles and light 1 candle a week until all 4 candles are lit by Christmas Eve. Take a moment to thank God for Jesus coming and ask to be fully prepared in heart and mind for his arrival. Or use an Advent calendar you can get from your church office.

<u>Advent Devotions</u>: There are great Advent Devotions that go along with Year A scriptures for this Advent season. Go to the following link: http://search.elca.org/Pages/Results.aspx?k=Advent+helps , and then go to the Year-A Advent link in the middle of the page. Click on that and you can download devotions for this Advent season.

Be vigorous, creative and have fun watching and waiting for the Lord Jesus Christ. Celebrate his coming in the past, look for his coming again in the future, and be mindful of His presence now.






