Pastor's Epistle

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ -

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Let's unpack this greeting a little bit:

"Grace to you" What does this mean for you and me? As Lutheran Christians we believe that "grace' is the unmerited and undeserved acceptance, forgiveness, and mercy of God towards those who rightfully earn only condemnation before God, on account of the life and work of Jesus Christ through the cross. "Grace" is God's forgiveness of our brokenness, our failed attempt to be #1 in the universe of everyday life; "grace" is God's delight in us, God's wayward children; "Grace" is God coming down to us in love to the point of death on the cross for us; "Grace" is God drowning our mortal life in the waters of baptism and raising us to a new eternal life filled with possibility; "Grace" is walking daily – hour by hour, minute by minute – in the constant presence of God through the Holy Spirit; "Grace" is the Holy Spirit at work within us to mold us into the likeness of Christ and, through us, to bring the love of God to a world in desperate need of that same love.

"Peace" is the depth of certainty we having in knowing that, because of God's grace for us in Jesus Christ, we are defined by God as God's children. We are not subject to, obligated by, or responsible to any claims made on us by our culture's parameters - our identity is in Jesus Christ. We have innermost peace because of the certainty that God, in Jesus Christ, has laid claim to us and, as such, we belong to God on account of Christ. This peace brings with it, freedom; freedom to see outside the box and to be excited by the possibilities presented to us by the Holy Spirit.

So every time I say this to someone, and every time someone says this to me, there is a blessed exchange of the love, grace and peace which only God the Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ can give. We have the privilege of being conduits through whom this grace and peace is extended to all the folks we meet.

Too good to be true? Come and see - attend worship on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm or on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am. Come and see as we explore, "Reclaiming the "L" Word: Reclaiming the Church From It's Lutheran Core" by Kelly Fryer. This class will be offered after worship on both Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings through Lent for 5 weeks beginning February 25th. There is a sign-up sheet on the table in fellowship hall – please sign up so we know how many books are needed.

God is always calling his children to be "ambassadors for Christ" as Paul writes in 2 Cor 5.16-20:

¹⁶From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. ¹⁷So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! ¹⁸All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. ²⁰So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

During this upcoming season of Lent, let us be intentional as we prayerfully consider what it means to be the recipients of God's grace and peace in a world defined by its greed, violence, and war.
