Pastor's Epistle

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

I want to thank the folks from St. Paul's Lutheran and St. Mary's Roman Catholic churches who put in their time, effort, prayers, love and intellect into the joint class about the Eucharist based on the newly published document, *Declaration On the Way: Church, Ministry and Eucharist*. Both congregations are peopled with folk who take their relationship with Christ seriously, who desire continued growth in faith and greater unity within the Body of Christ.

I want to give my personal shout-out to Fr. Mike Volkmer of St. Mary's, my colleague and brother in the Lord, whose graciousness, humor, and friendship was key to this group's endeavor being a success. I also want to thank Fr. Mark Yates for his willingness to participate as he was able. Our congregations are more united than ever – Praise God!

This 8-week conversation between our 2 congregations has only strengthened my passion for greater unity within the Body of Christ! I am amazed at the importance of this beautiful scriptural analogy of the living Body of Christ. Think of what God could do through us if there is greater unity within the Body of Christ! God invites every one of us to participate in this great undertaking. Each are called to do our part, just like every cell in our bodies is expected to do their part for the greater health and wholeness of our body.

As Lent begins with Ash Wednesday next week, let us take time to reflect on Jesus' passion for you and me, and for all people. Let us reflect on how Jesus sacrificed his own body - beautiful and sinless though it was – in order that all might come to be reconciled with God and experience God's great love, mercy, and acceptance. Receiving these great gifts, we become a member of the living resurrected Body of Christ, alive in the world to bring this same love, mercy, and acceptance to everyone we meet. Life just can't get any better than that, can it?!

Be open to renewal, restoration, forgiveness, and transformation this Lenten season. United in Christ, let us go forth confident that we are working together as the Body of Christ for the sake of the world.

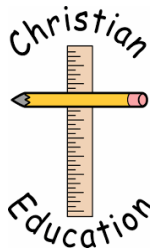

Reformation anniversary Bible study on "Galatians: Christian faith and Christian freedom."

"Biblical scholars describe Paul's letter to the Galatians as the Magna Carta of Christian freedom," Kleinhans writes. "Martin Luther called it 'my Katie von Bora.' Like his marriage to Katie, Luther's relationship with Galatians was a rich and lasting one: over a period of 20 years, he published six commentaries on the epistle. Luther's reformation was centered in the doctrine of justification by grace through faith for Christ's sake, which he saw as the heart of Paul's letter to the Christians in Galatia. It is also the heart of Paul's—and-Luther's message for us today."

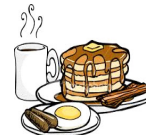

The committee will work together to create a procedure or plan that will help make it easier for families to determine where memorial funds might be utilized. This committee will work to determine uses of memorial money when its use has not been specified.

As for the 2017-2018 Council, the committee officers remain the same. Kay Spielier is President, Gail Clouse will serve as Vice President, Anita Simmons as treasurer, and Amanda Thomas as Secretary.

Amanda Thomas would like to be taken off of the Missions Task Force due to other obligations.

Ruth suggests younger members join the Education Committee, sighting that their everyday use of technology might enhance the opportunities we provide children at VBS. With that idea, Karter Spielier will join the Christian Ed committee and Ruth will go off of it.

There was a vote to approve the new members, motion approved.

Kay clarified a question from previous meeting: Pastor's work days are Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday morning. Her time at 50% is 25 hours per week.

Need council members to help find Memorial committee.

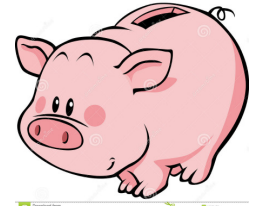
Worship committee needs to get the word out that Saturday service is now every week at 5 pm.

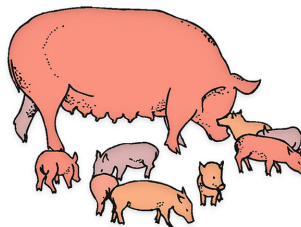
“Pigs with a Purpose to Fight Hunger” HELP FILL A PIGGY BANK



For \$ 30, one piglet can be provided to a family in need. When that little pig grows up, she will give birth to as many as 16 piglets each year. Pigs help fertilize fields and provide food to eat.

A pig in the pen is like money in the bank. Within months, a tiny piglet grows to weigh over 200 pounds! Should a family have a failed harvest, medical expense or other unexpected financial needs, this pig can be sold for much-needed cash at the market.

Meeting adjourned.



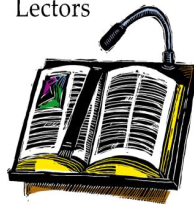

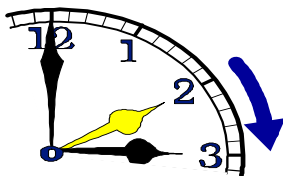
