Pastor's Epistle

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ –

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

All people baptized into Christ are not only brothers and sisters to Christ and to each other, but we all – you, me, and all Christians – are ministers, in Christ's name, to others for the sake of the world. Each of us, in our many daily callings – spouse, parent, friend, student, child, sibling, mentor, teacher, etc – are called to extend the love of Christ to whomever we meet.

One principle of that daily Christian walk is living out of a sense of joy. As I was thinking about this, I came across a paragraph in a neat new book the church bought, "Altar Guild and Sacristy Handbook: Fourth Revised Edition" by S. Anita Stauffer. Now I know this sounds stuffy and boring, but I was pleased to become reacquainted with the theology behind everything the Altar Guild folks do. Because so much of this theology also pertains to how the rest of us respond to God's gifts to us.

For example, listen prayerfully to what is written about being ministers of God (pg 10):

Joy is the principle attribute of the ministers of God. Joy is not the same thing as happiness. Rather, this is the immeasurably deep joy of our deliverance from sin and death, the great joy of Christ's incarnation and resurrection. It is the joy of our baptism, the joy of the gospel, the joy of the eucharist. Joy stems from our gratitude for all that God has done and is doing for us. More basically, joy is a natural response to God's presence. The joy of these realities enables work in the altar guild (*or wherever we are called*)[*my words*] to be carried out with a sense of privilege.

To add onto the end of that paragraph by paraphrasing a sentence – "*Whatever we do and wherever we find ourselves, it is ministry – which we do as a form of praise and an expression of joy*". Joyful people are so much easier to be around because they lift our spirits. They naturally embrace us as people beloved of God, and they welcome all as people for whom Christ died.

We here at St. Paul's are blessed by God's grace, unmerited love and mercy. Every week, when we remember our baptism at the baptismal font, we are reminded that we are baptized into Christ's death and resurrection. Every week we receive God's grace and forgiveness when we receive the Body & Blood of Christ at the banquet table. Every morning, we rise to a new day in Christ, and every night we can ask for forgiveness and sleep peacefully in God's presence. How can we not be joy-filled!

Let us remember what we continually receive from God and be a joyful people wherever we find ourselves doing ministry. Through Christ our lives are enriched and we have the joyful privilege of serving Christ by loving the people we meet. Thanks be to God!

Each holiday season, St. Paul's anticipates and relies on a seasonal increase in contributions to help meet our budget as well as do extra ministry. It is through the donations of every individual and family in the congregation that we are able to carry on our work now and throughout the year. Please prayerfully consider your end of year donations.



Poinsettia Mission Starting Nov. 2nd.

Poinsettias are wonderful, but wouldn't it be great if they kept on living? That can happen by choosing a poinsettia that the Missions committee provides. Instead of or in addition to buying a real poinsettia plant, you can use those same funds to buy ducklings or chicks for a family in a third world country through the ELCA Global Barnyard; you can buy a gift for a loved one through the ELCA Good Gifts store; provide for families locally through money donated to Helping hands or the Monroe County Emergency Assistance.

Three of the poinsettias will be very large - they are part of this project in which the people of St. Paul's take on a family for Christmas. You have the option of giving presents for the entire family, or for a single member of the family. These family gifts need to be wrapped and returned to the church no later than **Sunday, December 7th.**

Here's how it works: Each poinsettia comes with a gift tag.

1. On the front of the tag, check one or more of the 4 selections offered. (If choosing more than one, tell us how much money goes to each entity).
2. Then at the bottom, write the name of the person for whom you are memorializing or honoring. Also write on the tag what you want us to purchase from the ELCA Good Gifts Store - ducklings, a goat, etc - or if the funds are to be used to buy groceries or given to the Emergency Assistance.
3. Put the card and check in the envelope provided, and deposit them in the Mission's Christmas wrapped box. The missions committee will keep track of the money and send it to the appropriate entity per your instructions.
4. Return the poinsettia to the box/basket provided and we will decorate the Christmas tree with them.

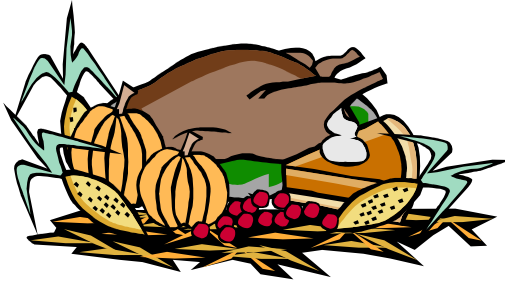
