Pastor's Epistle

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As I write this, All Saints' Day is fast approaching. This year we have over 16 names of people to be remembered; I'm sure there are many more folks we remember in our hearts. To remember these people is to remember that we are not a tiny, isolated group; we are part of an immense "cloud of witnesses" who have gone before us, who are alive around us now, and who will come after us. No one comes to faith in Jesus Christ in isolation – each person arrives in faith through the prompting of the Holy Spirit at work in the people around us. Faith comes from what is seen and heard.

The beauty of this "cloud of witnesses" is that their stories continue to influence our growth in faith and, in turn, we tell our stories of faith to the folks around us, whether they are friend or stranger. The Holy Spirit is so creative and finds large and small ways to remind us of the great love our God has for all people; through the children announcing in worship that God loves everyone; or providing \$.30 to ensure that \$400.00 will truly buy 5 goats, 4 pigs, and 3 clutches of chickens through the ELCA Good Gifts; or the stories about the quilts that are worn by people around the world; and the individual stories of God's presence and grace in the midst of illness or difficulties.

In the beauty and grace of God – all people matter. The stories of the young and the old, the rich and the poor, male and female, family and friends, neighbor and stranger – all matter to Christ who died once for all. Those who live in faith have died in Christ and risen to eternal life now. And we are called, as part of this "cloud of witnesses", to witness to the love of Jesus Christ as we daily relate to all we meet; to tell our stories of what Christ has done and continues to do for us and through us for the sake of others.

So what is your story? I would love for you to tell me how Jesus Christ continues to love you in your daily life. It could be really fun to spend the month of November sharing our faith stories with one another. Let's be attentive to Jesus' activity in our lives and share that story of grace with each other. I'm confident that God will work through our story-telling and folks will experience God's grace anew.

Christmas Baskets for Helping Hands: Sunday, Nov. 1st is the last day to bring in your items for the Christmas Basket Mission. You can still take items to Helping Hands until Dec. 6th. List of items needed are in the fellowship hall.

ON-GOING Mission for the Assistant Emergency Office Needs:

The shelves at our Ministerial Association Emergency Assistance Office are nearly empty. We have special need for items which cannot be obtained by food stamps:

Personal hygiene for men and women: deodorants, bath soap, body wash, toothpaste, shampoo, etc.

Paper products: bathroom tissue, etc.

Baby products: diapers, etc.

Cleaning items: laundry detergent, dish soap, any cleaning products.



ADVENT MISSION: Poinsettia Project for November & December ——Starting Nov. 8th.

Poinsettias are wonderful, but wouldn't it be great if they kept on living? That can happen by choosing a poinsettia that the Missions committee provides. Instead of or in addition to buying a real poinsettia plant, you can use those same funds to buy ducklings or chicks for a family in a third world country through the **ELCA Global Barnyard**; donate to **Smile Train** for surgery to fix a cleft lip and palate; or donate to **Habitat For Humanity** where they change lives by helping them build homes. (This part of the project will end on December 27th.)

The large poinsettias - are a part of this project in which the people of St. Paul's take on a family for Christmas. You have the option of giving presents for the entire family, of for a single member of the family. These family gifts need to be wrapped and returned to the church no later than **Sunday**, **December 13th**.

Here's how it works: Each poinsettia comes with a gift tag.

- 1. On the front of the tag, check one or more of the 3 selections offered. (If choosing more than one, tell us how much money goes to each entity).
- 2. Then at the bottom, write the name of the person for whom you are memorializing or honoring. Also write on the tag what you want us to purchase from the ELCA Global Barnyard, chicks, goat, etc.
- 3. Put the card and check in the envelope provided, and deposit them in the Mission's Christmas wrapped box. The missions committee will keep track of the money and send it to the appropriate entity per your instructions.

4. Return the poinsettia to the box/basket provided and we will decorate the Christmas tree with them. (or you can put the poinsettia on the tree yourself.)


