Pastor's Epistle

Dear Friends in Christ:

Grace and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

I can't believe school is going and we are almost in the month of September (at the time of this writing). Where has this year gone? The people of St. Paul's are very active in the ministry of Christ for which I give God thanks and praise. We passed out almost 1400 bottles of water to parade watchers during Restoration Days (even with the wet weather); we packed a dozen backpacks for kindergarteners in Albia; We had a 1st Communion class in which 6 young people, kindergarten through 3rd grade, learned about the gifts we receive through Holy Communion and will have received communion Sunday, August 24th; and we are preparing to serve 80+ people at our 2nd Annual God's Grace is Free Spaghetti Dinner, Wednesday, September 3rd, from 5-7 pm. Plans for Faith Formation classes for all ages are in their final stages. The all day VBS about Living Water was a great success in June. Christian Ed is planning for 2 classes with 8-12 children participating between the ages of pre-school through 3rd grade. Surveys are being passed out & collected requesting information about what the adults would enjoy for Adult Faith Formation. The Children's Christmas Program will be during worship on Sunday, December 14th, AND Wednesday Evening, December 17th. WELCA had a bake sale at Restoration Days; the Soup and Bake Sale coming up in December; is purchasing new white parametrs for our chancel area, and will host a Christmas Tea. The Missions group, after the Spaghetti Dinner, will be starting our Poinsettia Project again the first of November. The year will end with the Christmas worship services and the Healing Service on New Year's Eve. The property committee has been busy managing the church property and thinking long-range for both the parsonage and the church building; a new and efficient furnace/AC were installed at the parsonage. The Men's group did a big clean-up at the church and felled a tree at the parsonage. My gracious! God be praised for all God's work through the people of St. Paul's!

At the August Council meeting they approved a recommendation by the Worship Committee to move the Saturday evening worship service to Wednesday evenings. The last Saturday evening worship service will be Saturday, September 6th, @ 5:30 pm; the first Wednesday evening service will be Wednesday, September 17th, at 6:30 pm. All of these decisions were based on the surveys of the members of the congregation which were filled out in June. By a 2-1 majority of those surveys completed and returned, members wanted the service to move from Saturdays to Wednesday evenings. Many families and others are excited about the prospect of Wednesday evening services. I ask and hope that all members would get behind this new service time and support this endeavor.

As I mentioned earlier, I hope folks will complete and return the surveys for Adult Faith Formation; and if you think of something that is not on the survey, please write it down on the bottom or the back of the survey. Your input is greatly appreciated.

As you can see, God is working through St. Paulians in a myriad of ways, for which we give God thanks and praise. Change is almost always a part of doing effective ministry for Christ, because being attentive to the needs of both the local and global communities means we need to be fluid in our response to those needs. That means we may have to change what we do and how we do it. For instance, moving Saturday evening worship to Wednesdays means that the altar guild functions will need to be planned for Wednesday evenings in lieu of Saturdays. This will require some adjustment – but adjustments for Christ need not be difficult. The same may be said for fulfilling the need for Sunday School teachers, or mission projects, WELCA ministries, etc. The important thing is to keep our focus, hearts, and minds on Jesus, and God will strengthen us for any change required.

Something to Think About

This is by no means a perfect metaphor of the Trinity, but it is another way of thinking about our one God in Three Persons.

God is Orange

Orange has no rhyming word in the English language, so the word is unique, as God is unique. Orange is made up of two colors, red and yellow. Red stands for the fire of the Holy Spirit, and yellow stands for the light of Christ. These two distinct colors, when mixed together, make a third color.

Orange is a mystery, like the mystery of our God as the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Science has discovered that orange is the only color that does not disappear nor fade into the atmosphere. Therefore it is always with us, just as God is always with us.

So take notice of the presence of orange all around you as you come and go in your daily life. As you find orange, remember that God is also truly present with you.
